High temperatures have made for some tough work conditions but my staff continues to preserve and were able to meet the goals I had set. We have had some issues with our irrigation pump station recently preventing the ability to run water at will. The pump station consists of 2 vertical turbine motors which pull water from our pond on #14 and build pressure to feed our irrigation system. Without this functioning properly, it is hard to promote healthy turf. We have been able to "limp" along well enough to keep our grass alive although #8 and #12 took a pretty good hit from drying out. We are doing all that we can to restore them to normal condition as quickly as possible. We recently verticut our fairways, approaches and collars so they require more water to recover in a timely manner. Fortunately, we just received 2 inches of rain which will greatly improve recovery and replenish our water supply. There are many obstacles we must overcome throughout the year and we try to make them as seamless as possible.

Verticutting in short, is a cultural practice that serves the plants in multiple places forcing them to multiply into more plants thus improving density and helping to eliminate grain. Shots taken from the fairways and approaches should now bounce off the ground better and not get hung in the turf (when struck properly). Divots should explode and not come out as large patches I call "beaver tails". Additionally, verticutting removes thatch which will help firm up out fairways, approaches and collars. This process has not taken place during my ten year tenure here and desperately needed to be done. I would love to be able to perform this process once a year. Thank you all for allowing us to temporally disrupt playing conditions in order to promote long term benefits.
