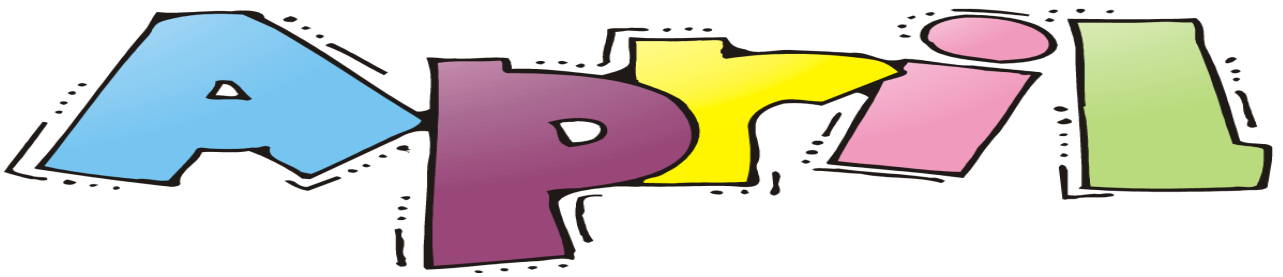

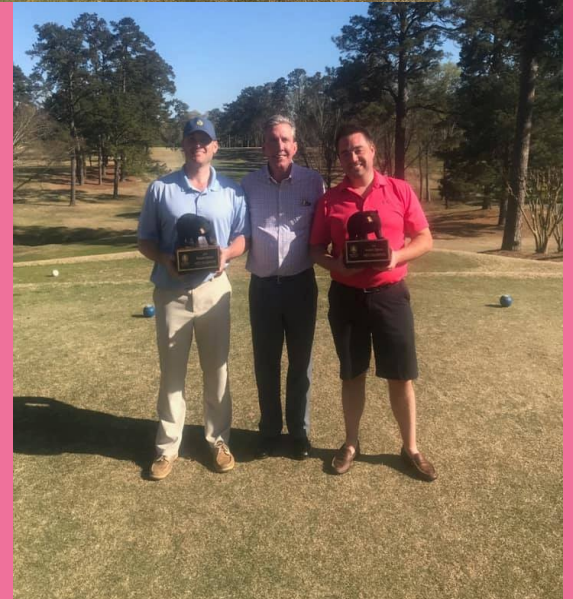

Spring has sprung and for that we are grateful! Fortunately we have been spared from the constant rain over the last couple of weeks with just a nice shower or two that are supposed to help knock down the pollen, although I'm not so sure it's had any effect. I can say we are finally starting to dry out. There are still some wet areas but overall we are beginning to firm up. Like normal we have had some frost causing delayed tee times during March and we may have more as we move into April. Fortunately the soil temperatures are high enough to prevent the frost from forming on our greens and the fairways, tees and rough can withstand a little frost burn with minor damage expected as long as we keep traffic off until melted.

The driving range project is still taking shape as we move into the "growing season". My staff recently planted thirteen Emily Bruner Holly's to help protect golfers on our new chipping area as well as create some definition between it on the #10 as well as the driving range side. We have been really pleased with the new appearance. The new sod on the back portion of the driving range tee is beginning to green up and as soon as it has healed enough to mow we will allow usage. The Chipping Green must wait until May to sprig the green itself to ensure a successful grow-in. Once we have installed sprigs it will take approximately eight weeks to fully grow-in. More work is set to take place on the bottom of #15 fairway but it has simply been too wet for any equipment to access this area. The contractor hired for this project has agreed to return to finish repairing this area once conditions allow.

We have had the privilege of hosting two great tournaments sanctioned by the SCGA recently and I am always impressed by their professionalism and courtesy displayed to myself and my staff. It is our pleasure to provide them with the best possible playing conditions during each event. As usual feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.
